## LET THE TRUTH BE TOLD

While it is not now correct to say that Columbus "Discovered" America, it is obvious that his voyages changed the world as it was known prior to 1492.

Who inhabited the Americas before 1492? Who were the explorers that came in contact with the native people of the "New World"?

One of the consequences of the contact of Europeans and American natives was the creation of the chattel slave system.

All peoples and the world of the future both benefitted and lost because of the system of chattel slavery.

For people of African descent the advent of chattel slavery was a holocaust that lasted over 350 years. Its affect did not end with abolition but continues to the present.

This new 53" by 37" color coded wall chart takes a fresh look and helps your understanding of that history.



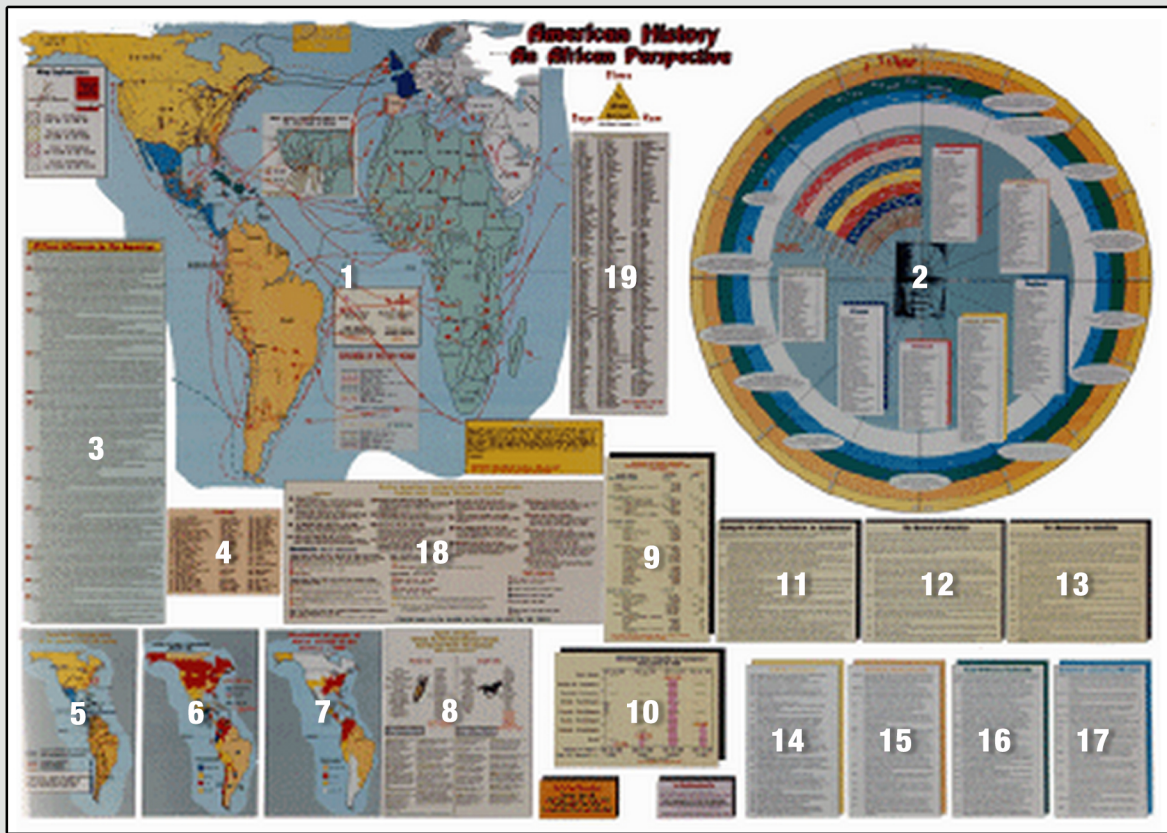

In the month of February, when we in the United States celebrate the accomplishments of people of African descent, we normally call it African American history. We limit our view to the United States.

Yet, the people of Canada, Mexico, the Islands and Central and South America are also Americans, in fact, chattel slavery of Africans existed for over 100 years in South America before it came to the USA.

Of over 15 million Africans to survive the middle passage trip to enslavement in the Americas, only 9% came to the United States. The other 91% were distributed throughout the Americas with the main settlements being the Islands and South America.

This chart traces the history of people involved in that great epoch. Learn of the contributions of the Europeans, Native Americans and Africans during this period.
